

This has been a very dry year for us in the Central Valley, more so than what we have seen in the past. This will present us with more risk for fire dangers. Dry grass will burn exceptionally hot and fast, this allows other surrounding fuels to easily ignite which makes it very difficult to control fires once they start. It is imperative to be vigilant and work together to protect our community and livelihood.

<u>Please cut your weeds as soon as possible and remove any accumulation of debris and weeds next to structures in or around your property. It is required to maintain year-round.</u>

- Cut weeds before 10 a.m. before the heat of the day to help limit the possibility of ignition.
- All weeds and DRY grass are to be cut/disced to a height of less than 4 inches.
- Cut all weeds and remove any debris within 50' feet of your structure.
- Remove wood piles, debris, and any combustibles material away from structures.
- All weed abatement must be done by MAY 1 to be incompliance.

Fresno County Fire Protection District will be conducting drive-by inspections beginning **MAY 1, 2025**, looking for fire hazards and properties that require weed abatement.

Properties, not incompliance will be issued a weed abatement violation via mail and/or posted on the property directly.
